I was wondering????....

We have received several good, and I'm sure, often asked questions for our new column. Here are a few...

How much dry food should you feed a CKCS daily? *Adult dogs require about 1 cup per day. However, you will need to monitor weight and **other treats** carefully. Sedentary dogs may only require 2/3 cup, active dogs may require 1/4 to 1-1/2 cups per day. Most respondents to this question divide these amounts in half and feed twice a day. Also taking into account how many treats have been given, how much exercise / activity was taken.*

How much water?

Adult house broken dogs should have a ready supply of fresh water at all times.

What about vitamin supplements?

Vitamin E and C and some form of Fish Oil are recommended. These are good for their hearts and overall immune systems. Older dogs usually benefit from Glucosamine/Chondroitin and maybe even MSM if they have joint pain. Nupro is another good supplement. It contains so many wonderful things like kelp & garlic.

My dogs have had several bacterial infections of some sort that cause diarrhea and the vet says are either "stress and/or eating indiscretions". Is there something non-prescription you should give your dog when diarrhea occurs or should you always go to the vet?

Therapy Dogs

Dee Wallis with Celia, Lynn Lake with Keeper, and Amy Martin with Angus visited the Morningside Adult Assisted living facility on Saturday, February 12. There they met with residents who were delighted to meet and greet the puppies. Ears were brushed, a ball or two were thrown and lots of gentle hugs and pats were given.

Always consult your vet before giving any OTC's but mine has told me that it is ok to give small amounts of Imodium on occasion when no other symptoms are presenting. 1/4 - 1/2 tablet. Consult you vet if any indication of fever, bloating, lethargy, etc. arise.

Prior to starting drugs try diet. The first thing to do is stop feeding their regular diet. Overeating is often the cause of diarrhea. Let the stomach rest through one feeding. Make sure they are getting plenty to drink so they do not become dehydrated(squirt water into their cheek if necessary) Then, if you are still seeing diarrhea, cook some plain white rice and feed them this in small frequent feeding for a day or so. If this does not clear up the condition it is probably time to call the vet to rule out something serious. Again, if any other symptoms present call the vet immediately.

Now that we have dog #2, on walks the younger dog barks and carries on like crazy when they see another 4-legged friends which has now become in vogue for my older dog to chime in. They end up pulling at me fiercely and scarring away the other dog instead of meeting up with them. Any suggestions?

Isn't it fun having two dogs! They teach each other tricks and will egg each other on just like people kids.

CGC training for the younger dog and a review of CGC for the older dog, both individually at first and then and together is a good first step. Walking the younger dog alone for individual bonding, attentions, and corrections focused on him without peer pressure, will allow him to learn the proper way to behave both individually and when in groups. Individual attention will also reinforce the older dogs self esteem and feeling of specialness.
