### The Club Year, Annual Meeting, Elections

**SECTION 2. *Annual Meeting.*** The annual meeting shall be held in the month of May at which Officers and Directors for the ensuing year shall be elected by secret ballot from among those nominated in accordance with Section 4 of this article. They shall take office immediately upon the conclusion of the election and each retiring officer shall turn over to the successor in office all properties and records relating to that office within 30 days after the election.

**SECTION 3. *Elections.*** The nominated candidate receiving the greatest number of votes for each office shall be declared elected. The nominated candidates for other positions on the Board who receive the greatest number of votes for such positions shall be declared elected.

**SECTION 4. *Nominations.*** No person may be a candidate in a Club election who has not been nominated. During the month of December, the Board shall select a Nominating Committee consisting of three members and two alternates, not more than one of whom may be a member of the Board. The Secretary shall immediately notify the committeemen and alternates of their selection. The Board shall name a Chairman for the Committee and it shall be such person's duty to call a committee meeting, which shall be held on or before February 1.

(a) The Committee shall nominate one candidate for each office and position on the Board, and, after securing the consent of each person so nominated, shall immediately report their nominations to the Secretary in writing.

(b) Upon receipt of the Nominating Committee's report, the Secretary shall before March 1 notify each member in writing of the candidates so nominated.

(c) Additional nominations may be made at the March meeting by any member in attendance provided that the person so nominated does not decline when their name is proposed, and provided further that if the proposed candidate is not in attendance at this meeting, the proposer shall present to the Secretary a written statement from the proposed candidate signifying willingness to be a candidate. No person may be a candidate for more than one position.

(d) Nominations cannot be made at the annual meeting or in any manner other than as provided in this Section.

Nominations from the general membership can be made in person at the March 15 meeting. The person nominated does not have to be present if you have written consent. Anyone in good standing can be nominated. Nominations will be read at the March 15th meeting. Elections will be held at the May meeting.

## AKC Canine Experience

On Saturday, Feb 23 the CCKCSC will once again participate in the AKC Canine Experience, (formerly known as AKC Educational Day) in Dorton Arena at the NC State Fairgrounds in Raleigh. This year our club will be helping out by having a breed table and by running Canine Good Citizen (CGC) evaluations. Many thanks to Dee Wallis, who agreed to be a CGC evaluator for this event, and several club members, who have graciously volunteered to assist.

The AKC Canine Experience is a large, local, multi-club, multi-sport event that introduces owners of newly AKC-registered puppies to and educates them about the sport of purebred dogs. The day-long event features educational presentations followed by a match, during which new exhibitors and future fanciers practice their newly learned skills.

From 9 a.m. to noon, the educational portion of the event is free and open to anyone with an interest in dogs. Topics to be covered include grooming and handling for both children and adults, finding and joining a local kennel club, dog show entry assistance and preparing to take the AKC Canine Good Citizen test. Demonstrations of AKC companion events such as Obedience, Rally and Agility will be ongoing throughout the day and area trainers will be available to discuss these activities with attendees.

Practice Obedience and Rally course run-throughs will be held at 10 a.m. at the cost of \$5 per run. At 1 p.m. an AKC-sanctioned dog show intended for newcomers or those who want to practice dog handling without competing for Championship points will be held. The cost to enter the match is \$5.00

Meeting called to order at 8:00 pm by President, Bill Nelson. Present: Bill, Steve, Amy, Dana, Dee, & Cathy.

Minutes for the Friday, November 30, 2007 meeting were read, and accepted as written.

President's report: None.

Secretary's Report: We have received correspondence from AKC on the show B sweepstakes are approved, and only two minor items remain for approval of the regular judging. Sally Carter sent us a note with a contribution for our Un-Yard Sale.

Treasurer's Report: We have \$3960.89 in our bank account. We have paid \$552.50 for our logo, which is about 3 of the regular price for a logo that pleases us all very much. We have also spent about \$80 on the N&O ads to reach out to the puppy buying public and \$100 to AKC for the show application. We have received a donation to the Un-yard Sale and the general show expenses. We still need to raise a few thousand dollars to cover the expenses of putting on the show.

Newsletter: Mary & Darrell Rich are working on a February newsletter. They need information.

Nominating: Amy has had difficulty contacting the members of the committee; she has tried again and hopes to get nominations complete to go out in the newsletter within the week.

Education: *AKC Match* Cathy is organizing our participation in the February 23, 2008 Educational Match at Dorton Arena. She is going to another organizing meeting within the week. Dee is working on the CGC test in conjunction with DKC.

Classes We will hold another set of classes at You Lucky Dog, starting March 6, 6:30 to 8 pm for 6 Weeks. Half hour of handling Lynn and Bill to instruct; hour of beginner- Dee to instruct, with Amy and Cathy assisting. Charge --\$100 for obedience for the session; \$5 per night for handling. 15% of total proceeds back to You Lucky Dog. Dee to do a flyer and get to the Newsletter and e-mail to members and past participants.

Programs: Next Meeting is the awards banquet postponed from Jan 19 to Feb 9; the program will be the awards. Winstons is the venue. Show Plans for the 2008 Independent specialty B In conjunction with Moore County Kennel Club, in Pinehurst, September 12, 2008: Veronica Hull has accepted the appointment to judge. John Gammon will do sweeps. Victoria Brown will judge obedience. Jane Forsyth is to judge junior showmanship. Steve has signed the contract with MB-F, Inc., to handle entries and the catalogue. Barbara Klos will be the show secretary, to be responsible for being present the day of the show, for marking the catalogue and submitting proper paper work to AKC.

AKC approval is pending receipt of proof that Alan Klos, doing Disaster Preparedness, is a Club member and that the Parent Club has authorized our specialty. Dana will submit these additional details.

We have an on call vet arranged. A Photographer is arranged; he lives in Raleigh, so costs are minimal; he is giving us a gift certificate for the winner of Junior Showmanship, and a book of photos of all major winners. The Regular Vendors for Moore County will be invited to attend on Friday, including the food vendor. Premium list is required by MBF to be in 4/29; Dana wants it complete by 4/15. Dana to check on the deadline for catalogue advertisements.

Post Judging hospitality on Friday will be at Janet Dalton's house for all exhibitors and friends. Judges question and answer session will be held on Saturday after the Judges Luncheon, in the Judges tent. Both of these events will be in the premium list under special events.

**Trophies:** Sweeps Flat ribbons and money in the classes; rosettes and trophies only for best and best op in sweeps. Prizes for Best Puppy & Best Op can be sponsored by the public. The Club will donate Best Veteran and Best Op Veteran in Memory of Joyce Board.

**Regular Classes** Ribbons for regular classes - flat ribbons for regular classes; rosettes only for RWD, RWB, WD, WB, BW, BOP & BOB. Flat ribbons for Obedience & Juniors, with rosettes for high in trial & best Junior. The Club will donate the trophies for Best Op & BOB in the regular classes. We will have trophies for first place only in all classes. We will have a trophy for the wins receiving rosettes and Best Puppy.

Gwen is authorized to order the trophies from Camelot for the classes authorized by the Board. They will cost us less than last year, but the charge will remain the same, so that the trophy donations will cover ribbons and some other show expenses. We will request that the Parent Club pay for the cost of the Rosettes for our show and the supported entry rosettes and ask them to put an ad in our catalogue. Gwen is authorized to send out solicitations for trophy sponsorships as soon as she is ready.

**Show Fundraising:** Steve will sell catalogue ads at \$75 per page. In addition, we will seek financial sponsors for the show at various funding levels to be listed in the catalogue. Steve suggested that the categories be listed as AFriends@ and AAlmost Friends.@ Dee & Dana will write a letter to any one they can identify with a connection to the club, soliciting donations, with names to be published in the catalogue. We will continue our efforts to raise funds for the general expenses of the show through auctions and other petitions for funds.

**Supported Entry for Moore County Shows:** We will offer a Trophy for BOB for the Sat & Sun shows; we will use two of the trophies from last year for these: A small bowl & a large mug. We will also offer Rosettes for: BOB, BOP, BW;WD;WB, on both days.

## Dog Training Classes

The Central Carolina Cavalier King Charles Spaniel Club will hold *Training Classes* this spring for all interested handlers. There is no age limit on dogs, but handlers usually need to be at least ten years old to be successful.

### *Classes:*

(1) 6:30 to 7:30-- **Canine Good Citizen training and pet manners** B

Some topics: Attention, sit, down, stand, controlled walk, Canine Good Citizen test exercises, "go say Hi," leave it, don't jump, take treat gently, don't jump up; adapt to unfamiliar situations.

(2) 7:30 to 8:00 -- **Show handling and grooming**

This will be a workshop led by experienced handlers who will adjust the sessions to the interest and experience of the students. Some topics: table work, examining and cleaning teeth, gaiting, grooming equipment & strategies of showing.

**Date and Cost:** The Class will start Thursday, March 6, 2008, and run for 7 weeks. The charge for the obedience training classes will be \$100 per dog for the session; payable at the first class; and for the handling workshop, it will be \$5 for each of the sessions attended, payable on the night.

**Requirements:** Each handler will fill out a registration and release form and pay the tuition on the first night of attendance. Each dog will be required to be current on all suitable vaccinations and free from parasites. For proof of health, bring a certificate of shots from your vet to the first night of class.

**Location:** The Classes will be indoors at You Lucky Dog Day Care and Boarding Facility, 8604 Jersey Court; this Facility is off Angus Drive, off Hwy 70 at 540, across the Highway from the Angus Barn.



CLUB FUNDRAISING
