## CCCKCSC Member Meeting

June 16, 2009

The Club Member Meeting began at 1:20 pm at the facilities of You Lucky Dog in Raleigh, NC. 15 members and 6 guests were in attendance, which constituted a quorum for the meeting.

Minutes from the March 7, 2009 meeting were accepted as published in the latest newsletter.

### Reports of Officers & Committees:

#### **President:**

We have just had the ACKSC National Specialty in Hyannis Massachusetts. Many of our members attended and showed dogs.

The State Legislature has been looking at a number of bills to regulate dog ownership. One bill addresses Afox-penning@ which is a way of confining dogs while they learn to track foxes; that bill has died. There is a proposed dog tethering ban (a bill introduced in a total of 30 states) that we hope is stuck in a Senate Committee. A breeder licensing bill was introduced in the House and the Senate; it is only still viable in the Senate, and is in a Finance Committee there; the wording of the bill is supposed to limit puppy mills, but it will capture many hobby breeders and put them out of business. We are making progress in fighting the HSUS legislative effort in NC.

**Secretary:** The Secretary reported that we received AKC approval for our Fall Show. We also received a letter from AKC asking us to participate in the September 26 Responsible Dog Ownership Day at the Fairgrounds. They would like us to host a breed table. The Board will be looking for input from members willing to help out with this important outreach to the general public.

**Treasurer:** Checking account balance: \$ 4,629.30. That includes one deposit (\$460.00 ) for trophy donations, and checks written for show expenses, including the AKC show application, an ad in the Royal Dispatch, and a \$300 down-payment on the trophies.

**Programs:** We are hoping to have a judge come to speak at the July meeting. Our Club participated in Bark Around the Park and the Shelter Rescue event in Cary.

**Rescue:** Lynn Lake announced we rescued 2 girls that were placed through the Blue Ridge Club. Lynn has placed our information ad in the News & Observer again; it had accidentally been deleted.

**Membership:** No report. Membership renewals are due by June 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Regional Clubs:** There was a Regional Club meeting at the National Specialty. Dee Wallis attended. We are also in touch with other Cavalier Clubs through an e-mail list for Regional Representatives.

**Newsletter:** The newsletter is on the web site. We welcome input for articles; Dee is to forward info from the Regional Clubs e-mail list for possible inclusion.



**Specialty Show:** Our sweepstakes Judge, Barbara Garnett-Wilson has been injured and had to withdraw as judge. Robbie Jones, of Rutherford, an experienced and well respected breeder, has agreed to come and judge. Dana has notified AKC of the change. Our show is up on the AKC and MBF web-sites; the premium list is being revised and is on the way to being printed. Jim Jones is participating with Janet Dalton in putting on our Exhibitors Dinner. Janet will be hosting our judge, Jeanie Montford, for several days before and after our shows. The Judges Conversation will be held indoors at our Host Hotel.

**Old Business:** None.

### Correspondence About ACKCS Rescue Trust

Here is some info on how you volunteer as part of the system.

Hi Jackie,

I think you may just be way out of the loop and behind the times! Any rescue activity you do, without benefit of being a Rescue Trust volunteer, is not covered by the parent club liability insurance. Nobody is a Rescue Trust volunteer, until we have all the proper paperwork, which is required for insurance purposes. The ACKCS Rescue Trust was set up a few years ago to address the necessity of rescue activities within the parent club and, have been taking in dogs for at least that amount of time. The Guide for Rescuers was approved in April, 2007. I personally spoke, at length, with members of your club at the 2008 National Specialty. They were made well aware of our policies.

Hi Renee,

Maybe I am way out of the loop and behind the times but I thought a regional club that was a national member club was covered by the national's liability insurance for their rescue activities and that the national was not taking in any dogs.

For the most part our club works under the auspices of the National Rescue Trust when we do rescue. We are allowed to place a dog locally that we have rescued locally, if there is a home here waiting. Lynn is working on taking one in to foster right now, so we might have one of these older special dogs available soon.

Hi Jackie,

If a Regional Club is going to work with the Rescue Trust, any and all volunteers must follow the guidelines set up by the Trust as explained in our Guide For Rescuers. It spells out our policies and really simplifies the process. I believe your club has this. To be covered by the Trust insurance, any volunteers must complete our paperwork prior to taking any action. Reimbursable expenses must be approved by the District Director and/or National Director (depending upon the cost and procedure). Angela Dayton is the District Director in your area and, I believe, has communicated with your Rescue Chairperson. Is your club interested in becoming part of the ACKCS Rescue Trust?

As mentioned in the Regional Club meeting this year, some Regional clubs are able to operate their own rescue program and willing to accept the liability. Other clubs just cannot afford to do rescue. Please don't hesitate to contact me privately if I can answer any specific questions.

Help would be very timely since we have taken in more rescues since the National. These are true rescue situations—not just a sweet and simple re-homing. We are expecting more dogs soon. Vet costs, even with discounts, are high because of the amount and kind of vet care the dogs coming into rescue need. We do nothing which could really be considered elective care—it is neuter/spay, dentals, vaccinations, diagnosing and treating infections, heartworm testing, chest x-rays to assess heart enlargement and lung congestion, insulin for diabetic dogs, etc. It is expensive to maintain these dogs. Most people prefer to adopt a young, healthy “rescue” rather than one of our older dogs who come with several health issues. That causes us to have the older dogs in the system much longer. They deserve to be loved and cared for just as much as the young ones.

We seriously need more foster homes across the country. Please get that information, as well as the need for donations, out to your club membership. Any and all help is greatly appreciated.

## Hanukkah Noshers

### Description:

Applesauce, peanut butter and vanilla combine for a flavor dogs can't get enough of.

**Prep Time:** 5 minutes

**Cook Time:** 45 minutes

**Temperature:** 350

### Ingredients:

1/2 cup unsweetened applesauce

1 egg

1/2 cup natural peanut butter

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 1/4 cups water

4 cups whole wheat flour

1/2 cup cornmeal

1/2 cup quick cooking oats

1/4 cup peanuts

### Cooking Directions:

Preheat oven to 350. In a large mixing bowl combine applesauce, egg, peanut butter, vanilla and water. In a second bowl, combine flour, cornmeal, oats and peanuts. Add dry ingredients to wet and mix well. Turn dough onto a floured surface, knead until thoroughly mixed together. Roll out dough into 1/4 inch thick and cut out shapes. Place on a greased baking sheet and bake 45 minutes. Cool on a rack before serving. Store in a sealed container.
