## Minutes of the Board meeting

**Central Carolina CKCSC**

Friday August 14, 2009

Wallis home, Raleigh, NC

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm by President, Steve Wallis. Present: Steve, Amy, Dana, Dee, Mary, Lynn & Cathy; also present, member, Jim Jones.

The Minutes for the June 12, 2009, meeting were accepted as read.

President's report: None.

Secretary's Report: No report.

Treasurer's Report: We have \$5,476.38 on deposit. That includes \$340 in trophy deposits; and 665 in membership renewals.

Committee Reports:

Membership: We have 9 or 10 members who have not renewed. Cathy has followed up with them, and they will have until the end of August to renew and maintain membership.

Rescue: Steve reported that the Club rescued a dog in Hickory and passed it on to Betty Ann Brown for placement by the Rescue Trust organization.

Bylaws: Dee has sent the Bylaws to the AKC for review. So far no response. We will expect to cover the proposed changes at the November meeting.

Education: The AKC Responsible Dog Ownership Day will be Sept 26 at the Fairgrounds - the Club will have a table. At the September meeting the President will ask for volunteers to come and bring a dog to staff the table and visit with the public. Dee will serve as a CGC evaluator for part of the day as well.

Programs: Dennis McCoy is going to speak at the September meeting about what a judge looks for; we will also attend the Cavalier judging and encourage members to use the health clinics to get their dogs evaluated. We may use November to go over the bylaws.

Show Committee: Exhibitors Dinner: Janet and Gwen have arranged to provide an entertainer who will do songs; Ed will cook turkeys; Janet is going to cook brownies; Jim Jones is in charge of the rest of the food and beverages; he previewed the menu. The Board authorized a preliminary payment of a \$500 to him to purchase food supplies. We cannot create a budget, since we do not know how many people will attend. So, we may need to add to that initial contribution.

We agreed to sell the catalogues for \$5.00 each. Amy is in charge of grounds & safety and will be arranging the set-up; she has charted the initial plan. Cathy is making a schedule of workers and will solicit people to volunteer for specific times and duties. We reviewed the items Mary has obtained for the silent auction and raffle; the Board agreed to reimburse her for the expense of creating the pillow which was a large expense and should bring a good return for the club.

Old Business: None.

New Business: None.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 pm.

Yesterday afternoon S460 was supposed to be heard in House Finance committee. At the end of the hearing the sponsor Sen. Don Davis (Wayne Co) withdrew the bill from the committee calendar. The proponents had failed to get a majority of the 27 representatives present to indicate they would vote favorably on the bill. All through the meeting both sides were counting who would vote their way when it came time to discuss the bill. That time never came.

In a face saving move, Sen. Davis called for the "stakeholders" to meet during the winter to work out their differences. This has been a very hard fought battle with an emotional impact on both sides. Finally, however we can put this bill to rest at least until next May.

I would like to thank all of the NC kennel clubs, their members and the individuals who helped win this for our side. To those of you who attended our March meeting at the Durham Kennel Club show, then the AKC lobby day, to the clubs who invited me to speak to their membership, to those of you who wrote emails and letters, to those who telephoned their legislators and to those of you who came to committee meetings time after time, I want you to know it was your efforts that helped sway things our way in the end.

We had a formidable adversary in the HSUS and their representative Amanda Arrington who had access to resources we could only dream of having. The op-ed pieces in newspapers, the financial assistance from a wealthy International organization, friends in high places - it all helped keep this bill alive when normally we could have killed it several times over. Unfortunately we know they will be back.

On our side we had some very dedicated people who wound up working almost exclusively on this bill and the several other AR inspired bills (Many thanks to Cindy Stansell for all her hard work). All without any compensation. We had you - a much better and larger grass roots organization than the opposition. Thank the Lord for the internet and email. We had allies, the North Carolina Federation of Dog Clubs, AKC, the NC Sporting Dog Assoc. (Joe & Henry McClees), we had several of the lobbyists from the NC livestock industry, the NRA, the UKC and lastly the NC Veterinary Medical Association. We could not have succeeded without each and every one of the parts of this coalition.

The coming months will allow us to regroup and reformulate our plans for the future. We know we will be faced with bills such as mandatory spay/neuter, crop dock, puppy lemon laws, and NC's own version of Proposition 2 in the 2011 legislature. What we do in the coming months will determine our future success in dealing with these potential new laws.
